2Dos

Maths

My Maths - when you log into my maths you will see a practise tab along the top. Under this tab there are many Y2 activities for you to try. After you could try the retaliated homework activities. If there are any ideas you are unsure about, you could go back to the Y1 activities to remind yourself.

Grammar - in the English section of Purple Mash follow the links through the grammar section and into the hatching out section. Complete Jim takes out the rubbish activity.


Spelling- again in the English section look in the spelling resources, then into Y2. Do the quiz for Y2

Music and Learning gmaes



Science

We have learned about food groups this year so this activity is a good reminder. There are some tricky facts we have learned so far.

In addition to these activities, children also have a times table rockstars login in their reading records, which can be accessed from home. Also, a parent letter has recently been sent home with children's my maths logins. The children have been shown how to use this site and can also access maths activities via this. Oxford Owl also offers a range of books children can read online. All children are still expected to be completing their school reading book at home; parents/carers can ask the children questions to aid with their understanding of the text.

Year 2 Pick 'n' Mix Work - 2nd Activity

What to do: choose one of these activities to do at home. You could do it by yourself or get a family member to help you. You can do more than one or even all of them if you want to!

Science based

Make a fact file about your favourite minibeast. Include things like what they eat, where they live, if they lay eggs and other things. Draw a picture of them and label their body parts.

What will you choose? Ladybird, wasp, beetle, ant, grasshopper?

Maybe you could go on a hunt in your garden and see if there are any minibeasts about yet. Keep a look out for them!



Maths based - Practical Activity

Ask your grown up if they have a measuring jug in the cupboard you could borrow. Collect lots of different containers from around your house. You could use things like an empty bottle or yogurt pot, a mug, a bowl anything really that will hold some liquid. Fill the containers up with water and then pour into the measuring jug. Read the scale on the jug to find out how much water each one holds. Put the containers you have found in order from the smallest amount that they hold to the largest. Draw and label them on a piece of paper.

You could even do this in the bath! (Just try not to make a big wet mess!)


English based

Choose a book from your bedroom or book shelf. It might be your favourite.

Write a book report about your chosen book.

PSHE based
