

History (VE Day)	Research what VE Day celebrates and why VE Day commemorations in 2020 are special. Write a summary of your findings.	Write your own wartime-style song or poem. (If you're stuck, try googling songs like 'Pack up your troubles' or 'It's a long way to Tipperary' for inspiration)	Create a brochure advertising a VE Day Street Party (for once social distancing measures are lifted). Remember to tell people why they're celebrating and how your street party will be special!
Science (Electricity)	Have a look around your house and create a list of items that use electricity. How many can you find?	Electricity can be dangerous! Create a warning sign or poster to help others understand the potential dangers.	Thomas Edison is a very influential inventor. Can you research his life and inventions then create a fact file about him?
Geography (Europe)	How many European countries do you know? Create a list from memory then use a book or the internet to add more!	Create a sketch map of Europe. Try to include the names of countries, seas, oceans, capital cities. For an extra challenge, try to include mountains and rivers too.	Plan a trip around Europe. What countries would you like to visit? What will you do in each country? You could even plot your route on your map from the 2 points geography challenge.
Art & Design	Create a cover for a new game. You can choose a video game or a board game. Make sure your cover is interesting, attention grabbing and colourful!! .	May 4 th is Star Wars Day. May the 4 th be with you! Create a new character for the Star Wars universe. Don't worry if you haven't seen the films, you can draw any new alien or human character you like!	Create a habitat for a pet rock! Use materials from around the house or garden to create a habitat for a pet rock (you will also need to find a rock). Think of all the things a creature would need to survive. Have look at the one Mr Douglas made on the next page.
Helping hands Someone at home will need to write a note in your book to confirm that these activities have been completed.	Tidy your room (and keep it tidy for a full week!)	Do the washing up for <u>6</u> different meals. [If you have a dishwasher, you need to load and unload the machine] **Please be careful when handling knives and sharp utensils**	Take over one of the household chores for a full week.
